on 1st april 1621, he did demise unto OWEN Mc.HUGH O'RELLY, a meere Yrishman, 1 gallon of the pole of lande called Ardmoan, for 1 yere; on 1st april 1621, he did demise unto TIRLAGH O'LINSHIE, a meere Irishman, the pole of lande called Leglan, for 1 yere; on 1st april 1621, he did demise unto PHILLIP Mc.GROGAN, a meere Irishman, the pole called Tonnyduffe, for 1 yere; and on 1st april 1621, he did demise unto GILLEICE oge O'RELLY, being a meere Yrishman, 3 potles of the pole called Kilcloghan, for 1 yere.—Neither the said Alex' Davison, Jennett his wife, Alex' Anderson, nor the said several other persons before mençoned, did take the oath of supremacy, and soe the said John Hamilton the provisoe & condiçion aforesaid did breake, whereby the said manner, pporcion & lands unto the said late king James his heirs & successors did escheate and come.—There is a  $\frac{1}{2}$  pole of lande called Cornewhoe al' Cornewhoan that doth lye within and next adjoining unto the said pporcion, lande & fmisses within the said fcinet and co', and  $\frac{1}{2}$  of the said  $\frac{1}{2}$  pole hath byne, since the time of the said graunt by the said tres ppatents made unto said John Hamilton, occupied & possessed with the same, whereunto his Ma<sup>tie</sup> was justly intituled, by the graund office taken within the said co' of Cavan in the 7th yere of his raigne; Knappagh, Cashell and Lurgaboye, to hold unto the said John Kennedie, his heirs and assignes, for ever.—The said John Kennedie did alien the same to JOHN CROWE, who did alien the same to ROBERT MADDINGE, who is now in possession.—The said viscount, by his indenture bearinge date the last day of june 1621,

are the most fytt to be hereafter sett to the meere Irish natives, at the will and pleasure of the owners thereof.—There is erected upon the poll called Oughall al' Moyneshall 1 fayer bawne of lyme and stone, and within the same a fayer, large and spacious castle, or capitall mantion house and buildinge of lyme & stone, vaulted, with 3 storyes in height, and havinge within 26 fayer romes, with 2 flankers for the defence thereof, and also a towne or village havinge 24 English-like howses and more, all inhabited with Englishe and Britishe famelies, in pformance of the said plantacon.—It will be very fytt and convenient for the inhabitants to have 2 fayers kept within the said towne of Oughall al' Moynehall, every yeare, one upon the 1st of may, and the second upon the 8th of sept' being lady-day in harvist, there not being any fayers kept, upon any of those dayes, at any towne or place within 7 myles of the said towne.—The antient foundation and place where the rewinated and decayed pishe church of Annakelly stands, is scituate in the uttermost and remote northe-east pte of the said pishe, within an island not passable to the same for water in the tyme of winter, or when the [ ] in somer, without great dainger, and the most pte of the pishe doth lye southe-weate from the said churche above  $3\frac{1}{2}$  myles, wher the greatest plantacon and British inhabitants doe nowe reside, whereby the said antient place or foundation is a most unftyting place for the same to be re-edefied and continewed in; and the most fytt and convenient place for the said pishe church of Annakelly to be now erected and built, is upon the pole of land called Gortneishe, wher the English plantacon and most number of inhabitants dwell, and ther, upon the top of the southe ende of the hill of the said parcell of lande, the quantitie of  $1\frac{1}{4}$  acre, the said Roger Moynes, the now possessor of the said pporcion, is willing to grante, that the same hereafter may remayne unto that use, and for the erecting and building up of a church, with a sufficient and competent space for a churche-yarde; and the residue to remayn to the use of the parson of the said pishe, for ever, for him to erecte a psonage house for his habitation and dwelling in the same.

persons being meere Irish, or any other person or persons which within 1 yere before such alienation or demise, should not take the oath of supremacy before the lord chancellor or keeper of the great seale of Ireland, that then the said tres patents, as to soe much or such part or parcell of the said pmisses which should be soe allyend, should be void and of no force in lawe; by virtue of which said tres patents, he the said sir Alex' Hamilton into the two last recited proporçons of Clonkine & Corratubber, with their rights, members and appurtenances, afterwards, that is to say, the 1st sept' in the yere aforesaid, did enter, and was seised in his demesne as of fee.—The said late King, of the small proporçon of Clonyn al' Taughleagh, with all the townes, lands, &c. thereunto belonging, being soe seized as aforesaid, did give and graunte the same unto SIR CLAUD HAMILTON KNT. his heirs and assigns for ever, upon the like condiçion and provisoes &c. as aforesaid.—The said sir Alex' Hamilton, afterwards, that is to say, the 24th feb' in the 12th yere of his said late M<sup>ties</sup> raigne, by said Claud Hamilton esq. his sonne and attorney, by their deed of feoffment did graunte unto GEORGE GRIFFIN his heirs and assigns, the pole of land called Gortendarerys al' Taghanny, to hold to him and his heirs for ever.—The said sir Alex', by the said Claud his attorney, the 4th of mar' in the same yere did graunt unto FRANCIS COFYN his heirs and assigns,  $\frac{1}{2}$  of the pole of land called Dromhillagh, to hold upon the condiçion aforesaid.—The said sir Alex', on the 8th aug' in the 13th yere of said raigne, by his deed of feoffment did graunt unto STEPHEN HUNT the pole of land called Carrow, to hold to him the said Stephen his heirs and assigns for ever, upon the condiçions aforesaid.—The said sir Alex' on the 24th feb' in the 12th yere of said raigne, did graunte RICHARD LIGHTERFOOTE 3 poles of land called Drumchirem, Quine and Drumkerin, to hold to the said Richard and his heirs for ever, upon the condiçions aforesaid.—The said sir Alex' on the 6th june in the yere last aforesaid, did graunte unto said Stephen Hunt, Susan his wife, and Robert his sonne, during their natural lives, the pole of land called the Annagh, upon the condiçion aforesaid.—The said sir Alex', by the lady Jane Forbesse, then called by the name of Jane Hamilton widow, relicte of the said Claud Hamilton, and attorney lawfully authorized by the said sir Alex', on the 4th may in the 17th yere of said raigne, did demise unto ADAM MAUNDERSON the  $\frac{1}{2}$  pole of land called Dromgoha, for 21 yers, upon the condiçion aforesaid.—The said sir Alex' the 15th dec' in the 18th yere of said raigne, did demise unto JOHN Mc. GEORGE LAWDER of the 6 poles or towne lands called Droscoret 1 pole, Diserte 1 pole, Derilane and Aghavadran 2 poles, and Derindreahcad 2 poles; to have and to hold unto the said George his heirs and assigns for ever, upon the condiçion and provisoe aforesaid.—The said sir Alex', on the [ ] did demise unto GEORGE LYNFORD the pole of land called Dromardavan, for 30 yeres.—The said sir Alex' and William Lawder, the 1st april in the 15th yere of said raigne, did demise unto THOMAS COWPER and his assigns, the pole of land called Dromewollie, for 29 yeres.—The said sir Alex', the 20th july 1621, did assign unto said sir Francis Hamilton knt. and baronet, the said manor or proporçon of Clonyn al' Taghleagh, to hold unto him his heirs and assigns for ever, upon the condiçion and provisoe aforesaid.—The said Francis Hamilton, Thomas Cowper, George Lynford, George Lawder, sir Alex' Hamilton, Alex' Lawder, William Lawder, John Hamilton, nor anie of them, did not take the said oaths of supremacy; and soe the said sir Claud Hamilton the condiçion and provisoe in the said tres patents mençoned did breake, whereby the said mannor, &c. unto the said late King in his life time, and unto King Charles that now is, did escheate and come.—The said townes and pcells of land are called by divers other names, a great part whereof are as followeth, viz. the pole called Nardra hath severall parcells called Dromonlister, Collemonie and Achulchie; the pole called Lahard hath these parcells Drumlummen, Lislegan and Bodaghatarowe; the pole called Grancharoe is knowne by the name of Dromcone, whereof Dromulan, Corluste, Drommavra and Sra are pcells; the pole called Quine hath severall pcells called Choistruse, Clourvise & Tomesure; the 2 poles called Shancorowe hath these parcells, viz. Malaghsancure, Achinacraife, Curre, Gurtein, Dromchochill, Calrache, Mollaghbry and Tominvia; the pole called Dromchirine hath severall parcells called Life, Sra, Knock and Achadreshill; the pole called Carrowe is known by the name of Curre, whereof Achorble, Cornecleachie, Knockavaddier and Currard are pcells; the pole called Dromchollin is knowne by the name Dromwhillan, whereof Garrowhure, Tonemacilver, Lisdromwhillan and Curcuise are pcell; the  $\frac{1}{2}$  of the pole called Dromgawne hath these pcells, Tawlaght, Garrinnagh and Copinagh; the pole called Dromgoha is known by the name of Dromgo, whereof Shancure, Tavinagh, Derrinnicross and Karkifeaan are pcells; the pole called Keilagh hath these parcells Portannequein, Kinkeill, Mullaghfernagh and Lanycranagh; the  $\frac{1}{2}$  pole called Taghomine is known by the name of Gartnardoris, whereof Dromcullin, Achagrane & Gawgagan are pcells; the pole called Annagh hath these parcells, Quitobanasho; the 2 poles called Ferrenfure hath these pcells, Dromchorin, Aghochonsun, Moylinnewillie and Curriglas; the pole called Clonkine hath these pcells Achavollan, Cornefina, Fallaghe and Gurteine; the pole called Drombesse hath these pcells Garvaghe, Drommeinvairie and Corriglas; the pole called Dromkeirin is known by the name of Dromkirin, whereof Gaugginreache, Ballina, Aghnafulboy and Tonagh are pcell; the 11 partes of the pole called Dromroe hath these pcells, Dromero, Doliss, Mullaghboy, Tomnaderye and Tonicramman; the 3 parts of the pole called Dromhillagh hath these pcells, Knockivi, Dromgerige and Killaghihirin.—The said townes & lands before mençoned as pcell of the said small proporçon of Corrotubber, are likewise called and knowne by divers other names, and doe consist of severall other parcells, that is to say, the pole called Behe hath these pcells, Behebrome and Behebane; the pole called Brufe hath these parcells, Coranage; the pole called Gortneterife hath these pcells, Curchoifintagh, Gallidie, Calmanagh and Achmore; the 4 poles called Sallaghy hath these pcells, Dineyon 1 pole, Knocknecachie 1 pole, Garninhoan  $\frac{1}{2}$  pole, Dromgrieske  $\frac{1}{2}$  pole, and Lisdigen, Cornekillagh, Ackakerin, Curlarr, Knockvan, Curriduffie and Curnedawin are parcells of the same; the pole called Dromchachy is known by the name of Drumrecharie, whereof Driverinighesh, Droghgownagh, Gartinecrannagh and Gurtinrevagh are pcell; the pole called Nalosty is otherwise called Nalossit, whereof Lebilaisit, Gortinnaraddraw, Johenarragh and Gortierogall are pcell; the pole called Corratubber hath these pcells; Annaghcorkeran, Knocknecast and Achecrose; the pole called Aghavahan hath these pcells, Achadowrie, Cormichneill, Gareris, Curcheir, Curclair, Curveie, Chanlaw and Cornebanc; the pole called Cor-Ihy is otherwise called Carrie, whereof Currofed, Achnaloch, Shanmullagh and Doune are pcell; the pole called Clanne hath these parcells, Achamore, Lismacphillip, Skreebagh, Mollissmottan, Carrigolan, Aghinniskey, Curvillishe, and Derrinicaple; the 2 poles called Portennure hath these pcells, Raffin, Killnecarowe, Cornekillie, Corneglasse [ ] and Curriskent; the pole and  $\frac{1}{2}$  of a pole called Mulrack hath these parcells, [ ] and Achbuy; the pole called Syhoran hath these parcells, Curbonny, [ ] Tonesillagh and Tonechard; the 3 parts of the pole called Aghoncho is otherwise called Aghknocke, whereof [ ] Dromrickard, Shanmollagh Turnemadden, Cloyche, Tonehullin and Gulhargagh are parcell.—The said townes and lands before mençoned

as pcell of the small proporcion of Clonyn al' Taghleagh, are called by divers other names, and doe consist of severall other pcells, viz. the said 2 poles called Derryweila are otherwise called Derrewell, whereof Cnuknahorna, Dromnecaffadie, Gortny, Culminein, Curmonagh, Currierin, Curriart, Curnemullie, Curranana and Curnespidocke are pcells; the pole called Dereeskeart hath these pcells, Cornekarrow, Knockduff, Rushshein, Chamber, Cornawletuber and Gortningranahie; the pole called Disert hath these pcells, Corrach and Corredonagh; the pole called Derry-laghin is otherwise called by the name of Aghavadrin, whereof Knockcolum, Leofin, Cappaghe, Gurtivir, Coriglas, Tewloche, Gortinkewache, Cadraghe, Clachogach, Lurgindvi and Mullatawna are pcells; the 2 poles called Derrindrehide is otherwise called by the name of Derrindraith, whereof Coulnesillagh, Gortehull, Turreagh, Gortgrehy, Achadowan, Achnacloyche, Tonteggart and Tonevalle are pcell; the pole called Portlive is otherwise called Portluffe, whereof Dromrusk, Curmackilchevin, Aradd and Kilnecarroyde are pcell; the 3 parts of the pole called Derriged hath these pcells, Tonebullevan, Kegan, Fullegrain and Carrigate; the pole called Tawlaght hath these pcells, Coulnahinain, Carclea, Curragh and Coulnemuckelagh; the pole called Clonyn is otherwise called by the name of Taghleagh, whereof Tachamoir, Clonemeighragh, Tivilagh and Tivnagour are pcells; the pole called Dromerdavan, is otherwise called Dromerdennan, whereof Curlaghtamoine, Achinincart, Achingrona and Turrie are pcells; the pole called Drumrath is otherwise called Dromcha, whereof Curardinpourt, Knockbeache, Coullan, Tawnahinfin and Largan are pcells; the pole called Gortinagary hath these pcells, Gortinreaghe, Atibrian and Knockilivaine; the pole called Gortinacloghy hath these pcells, Gortinanechy, Achatawlagh, Tawinthurno and Tawinmullie; the pole called Dromcherill hath these pcells, Coulnenauid, Knockinnegorpe and Attoin; the pole called Clonose hath these pcells, Gortnekillifohin, Knockanvisfuit, Gartinneccassaghe and Moneshein; the pole called Drombo hath these pcells, Shanwillebanne, Coultubber, Achinivekille and Achinnebrouke; the 2 poles called Dromoligh are otherwise called Drumwillies, whereof Choiscaple, Coulcovead, Leag, Ruddaghdrom, Dromacho, Drombeach, Tonerassin and Carriglas are pcells; the 12th parte of the pole called Dromcartagh, lying next to the pole of Dromoligh, is called Dromacho.—The ancient bounds of the said proporcion are as followeth, viz. Behe boundeth on the north with Carrone, meered by a kind of a sinke runninge out of a boig to Coreadownan-mosse; and upon the west with Casshill, meered by a mosse and a sinke runinge to Corradonoghy & Gortineterme; Gortnekrans also bounds upon Carrodonochie on the west, meered by a runing brooke; and upon the eastmost parte by a ruine of rushes besouthe the brooke, into the maine bogge of Knocknacachie; Sallaghie 4 poles, all bounded by the river upon the east; Dromachie bound just upon Uchterache upon the east, meered thow the middle of a boggie mosse; Nalosty boundinge upon Uchterach by a moore upon the east, and upon the south some part upon drye lande, some part bee a boige; Corrotubber boundinge upon the Enagh, part of the co' of Longfoord, on the west, meered by a mosse and a brooke runinge to the south from thence unto Lochegawne; Corr-Ihee boundinge upon Enagh on the north, meered be a boige; Dirrininfirst boundinge to the co' of Longfoord, meered thow a greate mosse betwixt two poynts of Lochegawna; all the poles followinge Cor-Ihy, Clonne, Mulriocke, Arrinnagh, Portenewres, Achaveanes and Sallachies are all bounded about from Enagh, beinge of the co' of Longfoord, on the northwest to Uchterache, beinge of the Bradye's land, on the northeast be Logh-gawne and the river; Shancarrow boundinge upon the pole of Corliamoir on the southeast, meered by a runinge brooke; Dromgoun boundinge upon the Marahill, meered by a runinge brooke from Gartenadoris northwards to the logh, and on the north boundinge upon Derrie thow a greate mosse and boige; Dromgotha boundinge upon Derrie, pcell of the Illand lande, on the east meered thow a greate boige; Kyllaghe alsoe boundinge upon the Derrie, on the southeast thow a boige and a logh; Taghomyne and Gartenadoris boundinge upon the Marahill, upon the northeast meered by a ditch on drye grounde, boundinge also upon the northwest upon the Marahill meered by a running streame throw a boige, the rest meered by a logh; Annagh boundinge upon the north to Marahill meered thow a boige mosse, and on the northeast to Clonlaskin, beinge of Trinitye-Iland lande, meered thow a boige, and upon the east to Ferrinsuire, and upon the west to Gartenadoris; Ferrinsuire boundinge upon Clonloskan, on the north, thow a boige and a mosse, from the Annagh to a meane river, and upon the east meered to the river all to Clonkein; Clonkein alsoe meered on the east of Corliamore unto the river, upon the south meered by a runinge brooke falling into the maine river; Drombesse boundinge upon the southwest part of Drumgubruskie thow a greate mosse, and upon the west boundinge upon Tullaghe, in some place by a drye moore and in another place by a mosse, and from thence by a little syke to another mosse; Dromkurin on the west bounding

upon Drumgubruskie, meered on a dry ground from a greate mosse on the south of Drombesse, all over the hill to a loghe on the south side betwixt Drumkurin and Dromroe; Dromroe alsoe bounds on the east to Terregan, beinge church lande, meered thow a mosse by a small stripe, and upon the south boundinge upon Corone meered by a runinge brooke, and upon the northwest boundinge to Ardra; Drumhillagh boundinge upon Lahird on the east, and upon Dromheda on the sowthe from the Gubb; Drumgerige meered by a kind of an old ditch betwixt Drumheda and Lisdromerige, from Lahird westward to a boige upon the south of Dromhillagh; Dirriweill, boundinge upon the sowthe from the loghe betwixt Dromcassidie and Achkilbege, pcell of Portlahill, all alonge to Clonein, pcell of Portlahill, to Drumanyne, and from Drumanyne meered upon Templegurime upon the east, to the logh on the north side, and the logh and the river all aboute on the north and northwest to Achkilbege; Direskirt boundinge from the river westward upon the Coraghe, all meered thow a boge on the northside, and upon the east and south by the river and logh to the Machie, to the west meered by kind of a ditch or lowe wettish grounde all thow the woods, betwixt the Rushein and Lachein to the Corragh on the north side; Disert  $\frac{1}{4}$  a pole meered all upon the southe and east by the logh and river, and upon the north, boundinge upon the Croghin, by a boge betwixt the river and the logh on the west, and from that logh over to the logh and river upon the west side, by an edge betwixt Tachubane, Disert-Corrogh and Corredomahe; the other  $\frac{1}{4}$  pole of Disert boundinge to the Rushkein and Leachin, on the south, thow a boge to a logh, and boundinge upon the west to Machie thow a woode on drye grounde to Tachabane, on the north and east meered by a boge and runinge brooke into the river, below the foorde of Bellaghinfin; Dirrilachinge and Aghavadrin boundinge upon the west by the loghe and Templegurime, upon the south boundinge upon Drumaine to the Derrie, and thence to Curraght, to a greate boige on the east downe to the Evore northwards; Portlieme boundinge upon Corraghe on the west, meered by a kinde of runinge quag boge in same place, and another runninge without quagginge; Derrigyde all meered aboute by the river and logh; Tawlaght boundinge upon Snakeill on the east, from the river, on the south, over thow the woods betwixt Coulnachuissin and Snakeill to a boge and a mosse on the north, and upon the south boundinge to Shancrahim meered thow a greate boige; Clonein al' Taghleagh boundinge upon Snakeill on the south Dromerdavan meered thow a boige or runinge stream to the maine logh, and from the logh norwards boundinge upon Dirriachwill, upon the east meered thow a mosse in some parte, and in some parte by a drye meere till it bounde to Dirrachlie, and there meered thow a greate boige; Drumcacha boundinge upon the [ ] to Knocknehorna pcell of Feache, on the northwest, and from thence southward to a holl in the woode called Leagyveaghe, Englished the "wheyholle," and from thence all southward to Drombo, all boundinge with the Feache upon the west, beinge termont lande, meered with a drye meere all thow the wood betwixt the said Drumcacha and Feache; Gortinacloyche boundinge upon Dirrocochie, on the east meered by a drye meere at the hill foote of Dirrocochie, and soe northward by the hill foote to the mayne bogge runinge over to Moyher beinge termont lande, and upon the north boundinge upon Moyher and Tonicaragha meered thow a greate boige; Drumcaill boundinge on the north to Drumnoasse, beinge termont lande, meered thow a greate boige; Cloncuiss boundinge upon Drumnoass on the north, meered thow a greate boige to Ballina and Gartiloyche, and from thence meered by a runinge brooke or streame to Knocknehorna; Dromboe boundinge upon the Feach on the north, meered thow a greate boige; Drommaleigh boundinge upon the south to Croghin, meered thow a greate boige, and upon the north to the Feache, meered thow a greate boige, and upon the west boundinge to Drummenuskilan, meered by a runinge brooke; the 12th parte of the pole of Dromkartagh lyinge next to the pottle of Dromdromucho, beinge parcell of the 2 poles of Drumwillies.—The 2 poles of Derrywyle, otherwise called by the name of Dirriweill, doe conteyne 2 poles of lande distinctly called by the severall names following, viz. Culnahorna, Dromcassidie, Gortny, Culneneni, Cormonagh, Currierin, Curriarte, Curnemullie, Curranana and Cornespidocke, now are pcell of the said 2 poles, and have been occupied as part of the said proporcion of Clonyn al' Taghleagh, untill of late they have beine wrongfullie withheld and possessed by SIR JAMES CRAIGIE, KNT. and his assigns.—The lands of Dromany and Codrum likewise possessed by the said sir James Craige, as pcell of his proporcion of Dromheda, are 2 other distinct whole poles of land, and have been ever soe called, knowne and distinguished from the said 2 poles of Derryweill, and neither of them, in no part nor anie wise, belonginge unto the other.—The said sir Francis Hamilton is now the reputed and knowne freeholder and tenant in possession of the manners, proporcions and lands aforesaid; and the said sir Francis and SIR ARTHUR FORBESSE, KNT. and BARONET, in the right of the LADY JANE FORBESSE mother to the said sir Francis,

and their assigns, are now in the quiet possession thereof.—The said pole of land called Killshandragh al' Killtawnagh doe lie within and next adjoining the proporçons of lands aforesaid, and the same was held and possessed with the same proporçons as parte and pcell of the same, untill it was found out to be a concealment; and afterwards by his late Ma<sup>tie</sup> graunted, by tres patents bearing date the 10th july in the 13th year of his raigne, unto said John Hamilton esq. and his heirs for ever, upon the same provisoes and condiçons in the said former recited tres patents mentioned and expressed.—The said John Hamilton, at Killshandragh within the said co' of Cavan, did bargain, sell, allyen and sett over all his right, interest and estate in the whole of Killtawna unto the said sir Francis Hamilton his heirs and assigns, for ever.—The said sir Francis did not take, within one yere before nor within six months after the said alienaçon, the said oath of supremacye, whereby the said pole of land called Killtawna did escheate and come unto his Ma<sup>tie</sup> that now is.—The halfe of the pole called Gortinadoris, lyinge within and next adjoyning unto the said proporçon of Clonkyne, has ever since the time of the said graunte made unto the said sir Alexander Hamilton, bein held with the said proporçon, and his said late Ma<sup>tie</sup> was justly intituled thereunto, by the graunde office taken of all the lands within the said co' of Cavan in the 7th yere of his raigne, and yet, notwithstanding, the rents and profits thereof have byn ever since the taking of the said office, deteaned and withheld, as well from his said late Ma<sup>tie</sup> all his lifetime, as also since his death from the King's Ma<sup>tie</sup> that now is.—The halfe pole of Gart-inadoris is now not in charge, upon accompt, with the auditor of the said co', neither is the same in graunte by tres patents unto any pson or psons, but has remayned and bein held and reputed as a concealment.—These poles and pcells of lands following, viz. Behe 1 pole, Sehoran 1 pole, Garteneterive 1 pole, Dromharris 1 pole, Nalossitt 1 pole, Dromro 1 pole, Drumkearny 1 pole, Dromhainsaine 1 pole, Drumgowne 1 pole, Lahard 1 pole, Dromha 1 pole, Drumcaha al' Dromoherrrell 1 pole, Gartenecloghry 1 pole, Cloncuise 1 pole and Gartenegarric 1 pole, beinge lesse then the full fourth of the said proporçons, are the most convenyente lands, lyinge together, to be hereafter sett out and lett unto the meere Irish natives, at the will and pleasure of the owners thereof.—It is and wilbe verye fit and convenient for the inhabitants thereabouts, and alsoe to the greate furtherance of the plantaçon, to have the weeklie markett, now kept at the towne of Killishandragh upon monday, altered, and hereafter kept upon the wednesday weeklie; and that the yerely fairs, there kept upon Symeon and Jude's daye, may be continued, and 1 other faire there to be yerely kept upon saint Barnabye's day; and the said fairs and marketts are not, nor wil ever be, anie prejudice unto any of the neighbouringe marketts or faires that are kept in anie towne thereabouts, there not beinge anie fayres or marketts kept upon anie of these days or times, at anie towne or place within 8 mylls distant of the said towne of Killishandragh.—It is and wilbe verie fit and convenient for the inhabitants, and to the furtherance of the plantaçon thereabouts, to have a weeklie markett upon the saturdaye, and 2 faires yerely to be kept upon the pole of land called Screbagh, within the said proporçon of Corrutubber, the first faire to be upon assencion daie, and the other upon St. Andrew's day, yerelie, there not beinge anie faires or markytts upon anie of those daies kept at anie towne or place within 8 mylls distance of the said towne of Screbagh.—The parishe of Granard is a verie large and spacious parishe, and there beinge some parte where a great plantaçon of British inhabitants are resident, about 8 mylls distant from the ancient parish church of Granard, and upon the said pole of Scribagh within the said proporçon of Corrutubber, where there hath, of antient time, bein 2 severall chappells of ease, maintained and kept for the service of God, and the ease of the parishioners, same wilbe and is a verie fit and convenient place for the placinge and settinge upp of another parish church, at the charge of the said inhabitants.—The said sir Francis Hamilton is ready and willinge to sett out 2 acres of lande, that shall lye convenientlie for a church and church-yearde, and a parsonadge house, to be hereafter erected and builte upp, and by him to be assured to remayne for ever, soe that at divers times in the winter season, when the weather is foule and waters upp, the remote inhabitants of the said parishe upon the proporçon of Corrutubber, and others about the Scribagh aforesaid, who are not able without much trouble and danger to repaire unto the said antient mother parish church of Granard, may repaire.—Since the time of the graunts made unto the said sir Alex' Hamilton and sir Claud Hamilton, there hath bein built upon the said pole of land called Killough al' Castle-Killagh, within the said proporçon of Clonkyne, by the said sir Alex' and his assigns, one baune of lyme and stone, 60 foote square and 12 foote in height; and within the same is built a fayre and sufficient castle or capitall mansion house of lyme and stonne, 4 storyes in height, with flankers and turrets for the better defence thereof, and 2 other turrets of lyme and stone upon the said wall for defence thereof; and also a towne consisting of 34 English-like houses, and British inhabitants dwelling within

the same, upon the pole of land called Killshandra, where the said marketts and fayres are kept.—Upon the pole of land called Derendredhead, being a parcell of the proporçon of Clonyn, there is built a bawne of lyme and stone, 60 foote in breadth, 120 in length and 10 in height; and a stone house of 2 storyes in height, with 4 turrets at each quarter, for and in full performance of the said plantaçon of all the said proporçons.
